



DAN is a busy fellow. He is always on the go.

But a cowboy crying? How could that be?


“Why, that’s nothing to cry over,” Mother

Next day Dan hitched up Spotty his pup to take his sister Carly's doll for a ride.


But Spotty saw a cat he wanted to chase, and
he forgot all about that doll.


Lickety split, Spotty started off!





The wagon tipped over. The doll tumbled out. And Carly started to cry, "My baby hurt herself," because the doll had a bump on her head.






“This is nothing to cry over,” said brother Dan. “I know just what to do.”

"We'll bandage it up." And he did that too.






He pulled out the little string on the bandage wrap. He picked the bandage out and held the two stiff pieces. And zip! that bandage was on the doll's head.

new.”






“Woof!” said Spotty, and held up his paw.
